International symposium and presentation of the ALPhA-Project's results on 20th & 21st June 2016











ALPhA

Research Project on Internet Commerce and Pharmaceutical Crime

The Internet mail order business with illegal medicinal products from illegal online-"pharmacies" has evolved into a noticeable growth market. Due to the high profit margins and the low risks of detection, the trade in falsified medicinal products has become even more attractive than the trade in narcotics. This scenario is the initial point of the Research Project on Internet Commerce and Pharmaceutical Crime (ALPhA), which is funded by the German Federal Ministry for Education and Research.

The joint project pursues a holistic approach in its analysis of Internet-based crime regarding medicinal products. Besides the empirical analysis of the structures around the offenders and offences in this crime area and the collection of relevant national regulatory instruments, private and public law intervention and prevention alternatives have been developed. Additionally, a comparative law study on criminal instruments in the 28 Member States of the European Union was carried out under the aspects of criminal liability, procedural law and of cross-border legal assistance.

The goal of the project is to develop applicable recommendations for the improved prosecution of internet-based pharmaceutical crime and to provide a broad body of empirical evidence for effective policymaking.

The results of the project will be presented during the symposium "Present and Future of Countering Pharmaceutical Crime". Furthermore, the event will offer the opportunity to discuss the development of this area of crime with the Public, civil, science, economy and professional communities.
